**Task Force on FIG and the Sustainable Development Goals
Report of Activities 2024**

The report reflects on the achievements of the 2024 year plan, which is based on the Terms of Reference, as approved by the General Assembly during FIG Working Week 2023 in Orlando.

1. Objectives of the Task Force

The main objective of the Task Force is to ensure that **‘in 2026 the understanding of the 2030 Agenda and the relevance of the SDGs for our profession are embedded within FIG’**.

The target groups of the Task Force are the FIG delegates, Member Associations, delegates & partners of FIG and the formal FIG representatives (President, council, commission and network chairs).

To achieve the overall objective, the following specific objectives are determined:

- Increasing understanding of the 2030 Agenda
- Raising awareness of the importance of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs for FIG
- Informing & Inspiring the FIG Community
- Assessment of needs & measuring the progress

2. Activities in 2024

The biggest impact of the FIG SDG Task Force was during the FIG Working Week in Ghana, held from 18th to 24th May 2024. This event provided a dynamic platform for discussing and promoting the integration of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within the surveying profession. The FIG Working Week in Ghana was a resounding success, underscoring the critical importance of integrating SDGs within the surveying profession. This report highlights key outcomes and showcases notable achievements such as the enhanced visibility of SDGs in technical programs and the successful local organization of the legacy project.



1. Pre-FIG WW 2024 events

Commission Banners

A separate poster was designed for each commission to indicate the relevant SDGs for that commission. Also, the way the commission is contributing to the 2030 Agenda was captured in an overall slogan. These were designed with the aim of enhancing SDGs visibility with FIG commissions using banners. The design of the commission banners received high praise for their visual appeal and clarity. Participants and commission chairs appreciated the effectiveness of the posters in conveying key messages.

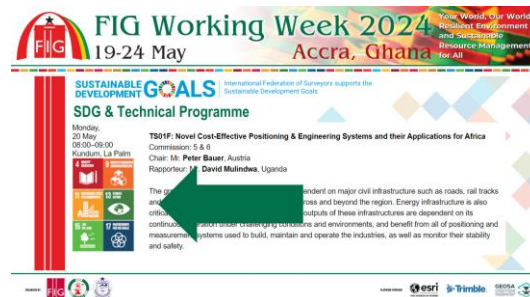

Technical Programme

With the Conference Theme “Your World, Our World: Resilient and Sustainable Resource Management for All” we aimed to have the SDGs visibility in the technical program. SDGs were prominently visible in the online programme, with session organizers effectively incorporating them into their templates. Also with the template, the technical sessions succeeded in raising awareness about SDGs among participants.

A slide about the SDGs was incorporated into the Working Week template for presenters to relate their work with the Sustainable Development Goals. The FIG2024 template was well-received and effectively raised awareness about SDGs among presenters and attendees. A Lesson Learned: Presenters often left all SDGs visible on the slides instead of selecting the specific goals relevant to their presentations. For future events a guideline will be developed.



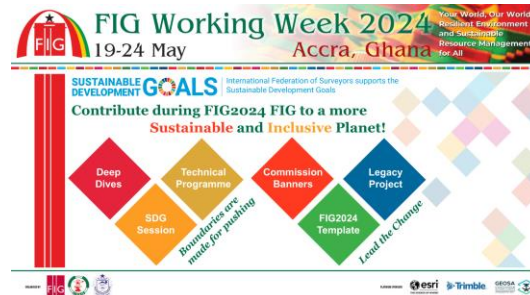
Presentation Template during FIG Working Week

2. FIG WW 2024 events and SDG TF involvement

The Working Week in Ghana was a significant opportunity for members to connect, collaborate, and share insights. Participants appreciated the face-to-face interactions, which strengthened the sense of teamwork and cooperation. Many members were inspired by the interactions and presentations, finding the event intense and rewarding. The experience reinforced the importance of promoting SDGs through our professional activities.

The activities of the Task Force contributed to objectives 1) Increasing understanding of the 2030 Agenda, 2) Raising awareness of the importance of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs for FIG, and 3) Informing & Inspiring the FIG Community.





Overview of the contributions of the Task Force to FIG Working Week

SDG Sessions in the Technical Programme

The Task Force organised a dedicated session with the title “Measuring Progress, Driving Impact: Surveyors at the Forefront of Sustainable Development. Surveyors are at the forefront of achieving the 2030 Agenda both as data providers and as drivers of impact. This session examined the contribution of FIG, the FIG Commissions and the global surveying community towards achieving the SDGs. It explored the progress so far made by surveyors and discussed what surveyors can do to make rapid progress possible. There was significant interest in incorporating SDGs into educational curricula and professional practices.

The following questions were addressed during the session:

- What is the strategic Influence of surveyors in Achieving SDGs?
- How we, as surveyors, can measure progress towards achieving the SDGs?
- What are the gaps and opportunities for action that exist?

Deep Dives

Dedicated Q&A sessions were organised for participants to join the plenary speakers on stage. The aim was to dive deeper into the topics of the plenary session, to share knowledge, brainstorm and formulate actions for FIG to take to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. Three sessions took place during the coffee break, right after the plenary sessions were finished.

The main stage setup during coffee breaks was not conducive to deep, focused discussions. Also the allocated time was often too short to fully explore topics and engage with audience questions. Despite the challenging setting, there were valuable discussions. We continue the Deep Dives further in 2026 during for the FIG Congress in Capetown South Africa. This will help us to secure visibility, promotion and content of the plenaries and deep dives.

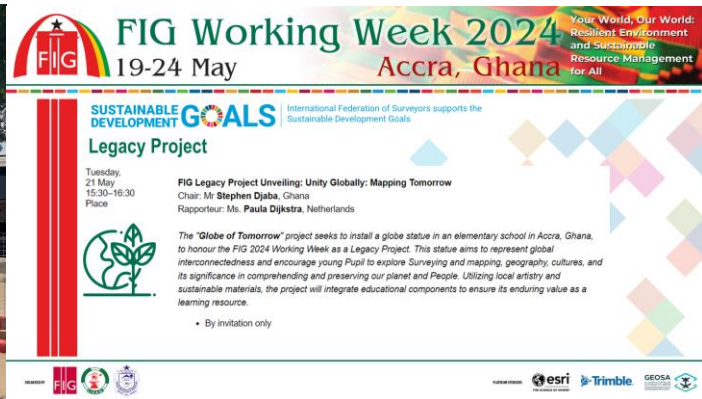

Key observations and recommendations

The Working Week highlighted the growing awareness and commitment to SDGs within the surveying profession. Participants demonstrated a keen interest in understanding and integrating SDGs into their work, emphasizing the need for continued education and support.

- i. There is a strong desire to incorporate SDGs into both educational curricula and professional practices.
- ii. Collaboration and knowledge sharing are essential to effectively promote and implement SDGs.
- iii. Practical examples and case studies are highly valued for demonstrating the real-world application of SDGs.

The FIG SDG Task Force is committed to advancing the integration of SDGs within the surveying profession. Based on the insights and feedback from the Working Week, the following strategic actions are proposed:

- i. **Organize Webinars:** Conduct webinars focused on integrating SDGs into education and professional practices, leveraging successful examples and best practices (March 2025).
- ii. **Develop Clear Guidelines:** Create detailed instructions and guidelines for using the FIG2024 template and other tools to ensure effective communication and understanding of SDGs (FIG2025).
- iii. **Enhance Visibility:** Ensure SDGs are prominently featured in both online and printed programmes for future events to maximize their visibility and impact (A permanent tasks with the use of Social Media).


3. Post WW Engagements

Meetings held

The SDG Task Force team meets every three weeks online, alternating on Wednesdays and Fridays and at different times, allowing Task Force Members from different timezones to attend. During the meetings, progress on the activities and updates from the region and SDG-related developments are shared.

The meetings follow a structured standardised agenda. With a check-in and closing to allow each TF member to contribute to the meeting. The middle part focuses on ongoing action items. The minutes are recorded with the use of an AI tool and, after a check, shared with the team.

Closing a great year with the FIG SDG Task Force ❤️

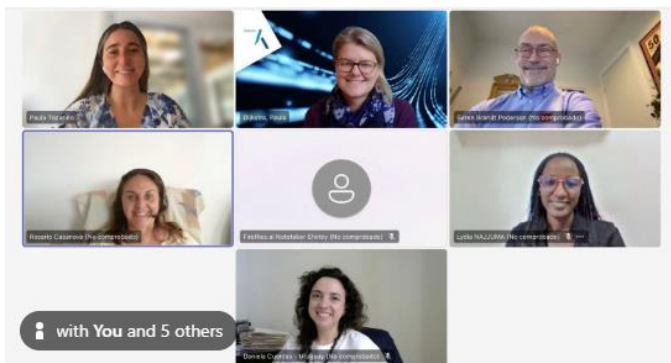
Last Friday we had our last meeting of 2024. It was a special day where we reflected on what we have achieved this year and started to map out the work plan for 2025. 🚀

ii) Summary of issues discussed and involvement of other commissions

Cooperation with Commission 2

The Commission 2 conducted a survey this year to gather information on various topics related to surveying education. Among the questions asked, the inclusion of topics related to the SDGs in the university curriculum was analyzed. The results showed that a very low percentage of the responses indicated that this topic is being included. Additionally, at the WW in Ghana, a case study on the teaching of SDGs in Surveying was presented, with the case of Uruguay, as part of the SDG and Commission 2 sessions. During this activity, interest in promoting this topic was identified, which has served as the starting point for the webinar that will take place in March 2025.

Cooperation with Commission 7

Below is a summary of the activities of FIG Working Group 7.5 on Women’s Access to Land and Surveying. Through liaison Marisa Balas, chair of Wg 7.5, there is a strong relationship with the FIG TF on SDGs.



- **Advancing WLRs Social Media Campaign** with a focus on SDG5 and other SDGs synergies, based on takeaways from FIG Ghana. Mention the LINK to the task force within each post.

o **CAPTION:** Mention FIG Ghana, Author, Title of communication, and links to other FIG pages.

Example: FIG Ghana working week organized a session dedicated to discussing Women's Land Rights (WLRs) and Women Land Professionals. Basirata Abudu-Akindali explained how important it is to **have female land professionals supporting the advocacy of WLRs** and advised us to start thinking about the education of young girls. o **IMAGE:** Based on Anna Schnaidmann's templates for FIG Ghana (her team prepared images of women and land), we were able to produce 9 POSTS.



- **Preparing the summary of the SDG 2024 report**, with a focus on SDG 5. Revise SDG 3 and 10 contributions.
- **Increasing visibility of SDGs:** Inclusion of SDG awareness in all working group discussions and presentations/communications.

o **Action 1:** FOR ALL FIG working weeks and congresses, WLRs sessions should:

- Speak to authors before any session and ask which SDG their paper focuses most
- Prepare takeaways (one or two strong messages) from all presentations. Design a campaign to divulge these messages, the link to the paper, and the SDG it focuses on (see post-Ghana WLRs session campaign)



o **Action 2:** Whenever participating in communications/presentations and discussing WLRs issues, ensure it shows the importance of SDG 5, or the synergies with other SDGs such as SDG 4 (as an enable), SDG 1 and 2 (as results).

o **Action 3:** Engage with Commission 1 (through Amalia) and 2 (through Rosario) to improve WIS condition (including gender aspects in the surveyor curricula and improving ethics and values through a new/improved code of conduct for surveyors) supporting SDG 5 and SDG 10.

Other Surveying events attended

UNGGIM 7th High Level Forum

The Seventh High-level Forum on UN-GGIM 7th HLF was co-organised and hosted by the National Institute of Statistics and Geography (INEGI) of the Government of Mexico. It was held at the Sheraton Mariá Isabel Hotel in Mexico City between October 8th and 10th, 2024. The three-day event was attended by multi-stakeholders from private, government and NGO organisations and institutions with over 40 country representatives and 260 attendees. The discussion was guided by 3 key focus areas for each day;

- Accelerating Implementation for the 2030 Agenda and Beyond
- Achieving a resilient planet with geospatial information
- Building a sustainable future: Innovation, Technology and AI

From the FIG TF on SDGs Rosario Casanova and Paula Dijkstra were presented. The work of the TF was highlighted in the presentation made by FIG Young Surveyors representative David Elegbede.

Regional Conference Nepal

The FIG Regional Conference, held on 14-15 November at the Hotel Yak & Yeti in Kathmandu, Nepal, brought together 300 participants from 30 countries, including Australia, Bhutan, China, Germany, India, Japan, Kenya, Nepal, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Saudi Arabia, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The event, organized by FIG and the Nepal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (NICS), focused on enhancing knowledge and capacity in the Asian region to address climate change and disaster-related challenges, particularly in safeguarding the land rights of vulnerable communities.

The FIG Task Force on Sustainable Development Goals actively contributed to the conference, promoting collaborative partnerships among government agencies, academic institutions, NGOs, the private sector, and civil society.

A Call to Action Statement was a critical outcome of the event. This call to action was formally handed over to Mr Ganesh Prasad Bhatta, representing the Government of Nepal and member of the SDG Task Force, by FIG President, Dr. Diane Dumashie.

Assessment of SDG Progress Report 2024

The Task Force is working on an assessment of the SDG Progress Report. The document provides valuable insights on where we stand and what needs to be done to create a more sustainable environment. The message is clear: "This report highlights the urgent need for stronger and more effective international cooperation to maximize progress starting now."

The Task Force aims to inform and inspire the FIG community about how we, as professionals, can best contribute to this task. To effectively engage the FIG Community, it is essential to identify and highlight



items that are particularly relevant to them. This involves determining which FIG commission each item is most pertinent to, using a table where Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are linked to specific commissions. By doing so, we can clearly indicate the progress made towards relevant FIG-related targets.

Key messages should be crafted for the FIG Community, ensuring they are impactful and easily shareable on social media platforms. These messages should emphasize the achievements and ongoing efforts related to the SDGs, inspiring and informing the community.

Additionally, recommendations will be provided for FIG Commissions and the broader community to enhance their impact on the SDGs and their targets. These recommendations could include strategies for increasing awareness, fostering collaboration, and implementing best practices to drive sustainable development within the profession.

4. Social Media Report

The FIG Task Force uses LinkedIn for communication with the community. Through an enforcement of the Social Media Team, we were able to increase the number of posts as well as the outreach to the community. The FIG SDG Taskforce's LinkedIn presence has been effective, with an average engagement rate of 9.35%. By refining the content strategy to emphasize three types of messages the task force aims to further enhance its impact on sustainable development discussions within the surveying community:

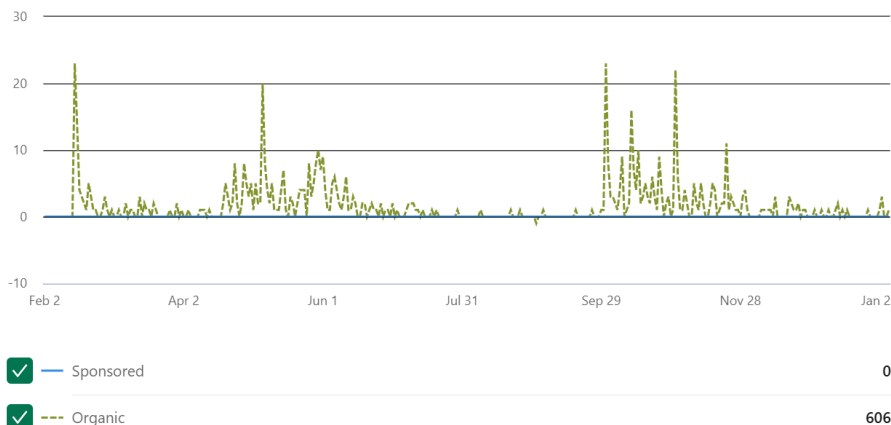
- With reflections from events with visual storytelling

By aligning each activity to one or more objectives, the Task Force has ensured that the FIG representatives have successfully demonstrated leadership by highlighting the relevance of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs, actively engaging the FIG community, and encouraging the sharing of best practices and lessons learned. The joint efforts have inspired the community with practical implementation examples, ensuring no one is left behind. As a result, FIG Member Associations and Partners have had the opportunity to increase their knowledge and understanding of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs, actively sharing their insights to inspire others.

FIG Delegates have also enhanced their understanding of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs, becoming active ambassadors for change. They have shared their best practices and lessons learned, further inspiring the FIG community through events, publications, and the FIG website. This collective effort has fostered a comprehensive understanding and commitment to achieving the 2030 Agenda and SDGs within the FIG community.
