Sitting on my balcony home in Sweden trying to summarize these four years as the chair for the FIG Young Surveyors Network I hardly know where to begin. All the amazing new people that I have meet and the passion that people engaged in FIG have for our profession of land surveying is just a joy in itself.



The first four years have been about creating awareness and making people within FIG understand that there is a need for rejuvenation within the organisation. This with the background that there is a difficulty to attract young people the surveying industry in many parts of the world and that the average age of a surveyor is just getting higher and higher.

It all started at the FIG Congress in Munich 2006 where the first official student meeting ever was organized at an FIG event. After this I was asked by the outgoing chair of Commission 1 if I was interested in starting a working group for young surveyors within FIG. I was of course and we had out first official meeting at the Hong Kong Working Week the year after.

The year after that was the Working Week in Stockholm and speed mentoring was introduced for the first time and one of our sessions was so popular that the FIG President Stig Enemark was rejected in the door. At the Working Week in Eilat, Israel we officially gained status as a Network within FIG and got our first budget.

This year we got more than one hundred young surveyor participants to the FIG Congress in Sydney, a new chair, Kate Fairlie from Australia, was elected. She is currently working on putting together a work plan for the next four years and a working group to make it all come together is also happening. You can read their presentation further down in this newsletter.

I hope that Kate and her new group will receive as much support as I did with mine. We do have the coolest profession in the world and we have to make sure that there will be new people to take over as an aging surveying population goes in to retirement.

I write this having just left the Sydney Crisis Camp where volunteers are geocoding to assist in the Pakistan Floods aid effort. It's simply amazing how much can be achieved with a few volunteers, a laptop and an internet connection. We translated SMS's from people on the ground, geocoded data into OpenStreetMap and generally contributed to a more targeted aid effort.

Easy tasks that anyone could do, from any location, with only a computer and internet. Extensive skills and experience not required.

However — such tasks need a dedicated coordination team, volunteer or otherwise. The basic infrastructure needs to be in place. And easy instructions need to somehow be communicated to erstwhile volunteers (see for example the youtube movie we made herehttp://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_Ub9PSLw7M 4).

And such tasks need a network. To spread news of the tasks, the needs and even the successes to a vibrant community. To you.

And so we come to the next phase in the life of the FIG Young Surveyors Network. We have the support structure – the FIG Council and community is behind us. We have the dedicated coordination team – your new Young Surveyors Network Committee introduced in this newsletter. What we need now is you and your ideas!

Some ways we think you should get involved?

- Join (or form!) a local or regional professional surveying body, and make sure they have a young surveyor group! Why? To network, get help with your career, get help with problem solving and to support and be supported by other young surveyors.
- 2. Contact your national professional surveying body – what support do they provide for you, how can you get involved and have a say in the direction of the future of surveying?
- 3. Talk to the wider community
- 4. Organise events to meet and network with other young surveyors and support the profession.
- Write up your events and share with us, so that we can provide ideas to other groups
- Share interesting surveying-related websites, youtube videos and other networks/groups with us (eg. Your university, jobs for offer at your workplace...)

I'm looking forward to hearing your ideas, and perhaps meeting you at an FIG Working Week near you.
