





What is our future?

Chisinau Declaration

It also requires a strong education and qualification as well as an organized continued development for both Surveyors and Notaries.



QUESTIONNAIRE ON MARINE CADASTRE



In June 2014, a joint project between CLGE (Council of European Geodetic Surveyors) and PCC (Permanent Committee on Cadastre) was launched. Other associations such as Eurogeographics, EULIS and ELRA also joined this project.

The output will be to create a case study about Marine Cadastre. Other European associations joined this project which could give useful guidelines for European Countries that intend to create a marine cadastre. By highlighting key aspects, such as the need for standards and to share best practice the intention is to enable national level projects to be compatible with each other and inter-operable across Europe.

There are four stages to the project:

- To collate the different texts, documents, directives etc. from the European Union which deal with the subject of Marine Cadastre.
- To issue a questionnaire to interested parties and expert groups.
- 3. To analyse the responses to the consultation with a view to define the most important issues that will need to be addressed in the creation of a Marine Cadastre e.g. data themes, data quality, data currency/maintenance, formats, coordinate systems, understanding the user community/customer, choice of platform (technology, tools, functionality, support for devices etc.), business models etc.


