## Women and Other Vulnerable Groups Land Rights

Land is a **crucial asset** for society

to build peaceful, stable, and prosperous societies

as a means of production

for household livelihood and for supporting poverty reduction

for cultural identity and spirituality

as an important source of political power and participation in decision-making

However, there are **gender**inequalities in access, use and
control over land and productive
resources

In Africa, more than 51 % of working women are employed in agriculture, accounting for about 15 % of the continent's GDP.

In developing countries, women account for 60-80% of food production

BUT women rarely own the land on which they work.
Globally, less than 15% of the land belongs to women.

With drastic consequences for sustainable development

Prevents the reduction of poverty and the eradication of hunger

increases inefficiencies in the economy,

impedes women's economic empowerment and resilience

## Women and Other Vulnerable Groups Land Rights

Despite several international, regional, and national efforts to contribute to more equal land rights and tenure security for women and other vulnerable groups, progress has been uneven and slow.

"At the current pace of progress, it will take 200 years, or 9 generations, to achieve equal rights over land and natural resources and women's full participation in decision-making processes" (OECD, 2019).

Gender-responsive policy and legal frameworks are essential to advancing women's and other vulnerable groups rights to land!
