Overview:

The general objective of the FAO-FIG collaboration is to disseminate the VGGT, raise awareness, develop capacity, engage professional, academic and teaching institutions, and develop partnerships and networks between FAO Land Tenure staff and FIG surveyors and other professional members as key land, natural and built environment professionals globally and regionally, towards improved governance of tenure and support to the application of the VGGT.

Within the context of the FIG Work Plan, the FIG Council has a vision of a "modern and sustainable surveying profession in support of society, environment and economy by providing innovative reliable and best practice solutions to our rapidly changing and complex world, acting with integrity and confidence about the usefulness of surveying, and translating these words into action."

FIG together with The Association of Polish Surveyors will lead in carrying out the FIG Congress 2022, which—under the overall theme of "Volunteering for the future - Geospatial excellence for a better living"—will include the VGGT and improved governance of tenure as one of the main thematic tracks. This will be achieved through a this joint FAO/FIG session organized to disseminate the experiences related to the integration of the VGGT into the implementation of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).

In 2019, the fourteenth Conference of the Parties to the UNCCD adopted a landmark decision on land tenure. Decision 26/COP14 acknowledges the importance of secure land tenure for addressing

desertification, land degradation and drought (DLDD), and for improving human wellbeing and livelihoods. To date, the UNCCD stands as the only multilateral environmental agreement to explicitly focus on land tenure.

The session will start by a presentation of the linkages between VGGT and LDN and will present newly launched FAO UNCCD Technical Guide on the integration of the VGGT into the implementation of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) and Land Degradation Neutrality (LDN). The session will follow with a panel session focusing on unpacking on those aspects of implementation by stakeholders, including Academia and what future action plans and possible investments are most needed in their respective domain.
