QUÉBEC, CANADA

The Commission 7 team, in close collaboration with our Canadian colleagues and the Fédération des géomètres francophones (FGF – the Francophone Federation of Surveyors), is preparing this year a unique event which will take place in the Old Quebec City, a UNESCO World Heritage site.

This great happening will start with the Commission 7 meetings on 7-8 October 2014 at the Montmorency Forest, one hour drive from Quebec City. Montmorency Forest is an experimental forest owned and managed by Laval University, a nice, quiet and natural area for a retreat to report on our work and achievements and to prepare the next Commission 7 Workplan. Then, on October 9 and 10, you will be invited to take part in the GeoConference 2014 (www.geocongres2014.ca/en). The theme of the GeoConference 2014 is « *Revoir notre monde* » (Revisiting Our World), and is organized by the International Federation of Surveyors (FIG), the Canadian Institute of Geomatics, the Ordre des arpenteurs-géomètres du Québec (Québec Order of Land Surveyors), and Laval University. It will be a unique opportunity to discuss, share ideas about the future of land management and Geomatics from a perspective of sustainable development, and this, in four sub-themes, quite related to Commission 7 hot topics:

- Smart cities and Spatially enabled society
- Land management
- Climate change and natural disasters
- Improving quality of life

Renowned speakers will be invited to present their views and to enable discussion around each of these sub-themes. Among them, Mrs Vanessa Lawrence, Secretary General of Ordnance Survey International and co-chair of the United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management initiative (UN-GGIM) and Mr. Carlo Ratti, professor and chair of the Massachusetts Institute of Technologies (MIT) Senseable City Lab and included in the Wired Magazine's 'Smart List 2012 of the 50 people who will change the world'. They will take part to the session on Smart Cities and Spatially enabled society. Mr. Gavin Adlington, the World Bank Land Program Team Leader and Chryssy Potsiou, president-elect of the FIG are among the speakers in the session on Land Management. In the session on Disaster Management and Climate Change, we will have the honour to welcome Mr. Edmond Mulet, Assistant Secretary-General of the United Nations (UN) for Peacekeeping Operations. Mr. Mulet will talk about his experience as head of the UN Mission in Haiti following the devastating earthquake in 2010. Clarissa Augustinus, Head of the Land and Global Land Tool Network in UN Habitat will join the session on Improving the quality of living. With the addition of key speakers from FIG Commission 7 and FGF, the round table at the end of each of these sessions will be for sure, of high interest. Finally, an honorary doctorate should be awarded to Mr. Hernando de Soto, President of the Institute for Liberty and Democracy and one of the most influential economists in the world.

With the participation of such respected speakers and the involvement of major national and international organizations, this event promises to be as successful as the previous conference held in 2007, which attracted nearly 1,200 delegates from 40 countries.

Registration and Accommodation

FIG Commission 7 delegates should **select the package GeoConference 2014 – Special FIG** which includes registration to all activities from Tuesday, October 7th to Friday, October 10th including the FIG Commission 7 annual meeting at the Montmorency Forest with transportation, access to conferences, exhibition, meetings, lunches, coffee breaks and 3 evening events (Get together, Champlain and Banquet). As the General Assembly of the Fédération des géomètres francophones (FGF) will be in Quebec City on Oct. 8th at 16:00, a bus will leave the Montmorency Forest for Quebec City after lunch for those who wish to attend.
