 - 4 main divisions

 - Property Consultancy Valuation Surveying Division
 - Building Surveying Division
 - Objectives:
 - secure advancement and facilitate acquisition of knowledge which constitutes the profession of a surveyor
 - promote general interests of the profession and to maintain and extend its usefulness for the public advantage



Private Sector

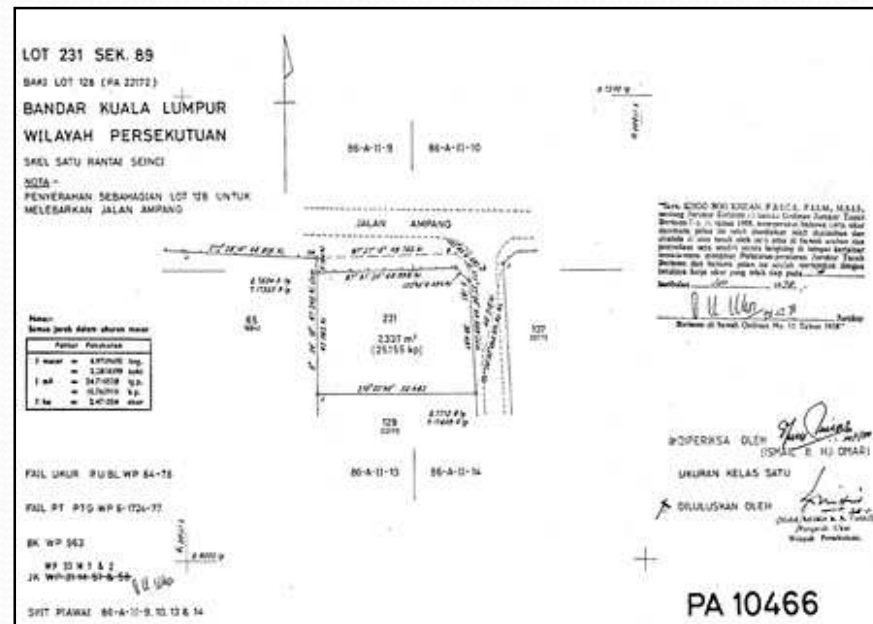
- Currently over 570 registered surveyors (80% licensed to practise)
- 80% of cadastral surveys undertaken by licensed surveyors
- All cadastral surveys are checked and approved by JUPEM

Licensing



- Governed by Surveyors Board
 - Land Surveyors Board Peninsular Malaysia
 - Sabah Surveyors Board
 - Land Surveyors Board Sarawak
- Objectives:
 - regulate and control the licensing of land surveyors
 - provide leadership in the upholding and advancement

Licensing



- Surveyors Board registers under applicable legislations
- Licence issued annually

Licensing

- Admission into the Register criteria
 - a citizen of good character
 - 21 or more years of age
 - passed all examinations
 - has the required period of practical training
 - not under any disability
 - paid the required registration fee
