WEAKNESSES

- Africa the least mapped and the most uncharted continent.
- Data poverty means decisions taken by or on behalf of Africa are not scientific or data based
- Few professionals to turn around the 30 million square km. Nigeria ratio 1 surveyor to 57,500 ppl or 1 surveyor for each 270 km2
- pervasive poverty: disincentive to savings and investment
- Security challenges and insurgency
- Weak institutions enables corruption to thrive
- Poor implementation of Action and Development Plans
- Underdeveloped capacity and unutilised intelligence
