Sustainability

- Sustainability; directly after the project ends, one year after project ends, five years, ten years... How to measure? Who to decide?
- Personal view; very difficult to ensure long term sustainable results with support from one doner and doner project. Several doners supporting the same development needed.
- Crucial to ensure:
 - Not only the management of the organisation must live and lead the change, it must go higher than that! Without political leadership and guidance, a significant project result will most probably be lost quickly.
 - Funding, capacity and capability together with a legal foundation

Liberia -

Capacity Building for Inclusive Land Administration and Management in Liberia (2019-2023) Development for delivery of sustainable land services in Liberia (1st June 2024-2027)

- New Land Act in Liberia
- Developing Liberia Land Authority on all levels
- Supporting education in this field in Liberia
- Close cooperation during several years with e.g World Bank
- Supporting the development of several regional offices
- The pandemic did not help. Challenge to secure sustainability in investments as organisational development, work processes, capacity building, technical skills and much more

















Liberia -

Capacity Building for Inclusive Land Administration and Management in Liberia (2019-2023) Development for delivery of sustainable land services in Liberia (1st June 2024-2027)

Examples of significant change, results and evidence that we are at least driving in the right direction

- **Decentralization of services** and operational costs for five County Land Offices that were renovated by the World Bank LLAP (Liberia Land Administration Project).
- Decentralized service delivery also intended to increase revenue generation and improve the financial sustainability of the Liberia Land Authority. The revenue increases in the two chosen role-model offices validated the proof of concept and the success of this intervention.













Rwanda - Capacity Development in Land Management (2022-2027)

- Increased Awareness on land matters amongst professionals in the land sector, Rwandan citizens and journalists
- Capacity building, leading to enhanced knowledge and improved skills amongst staff at NLA
- Engaging stakeholders, civil society and enhanced coordination with external partners

- Land at Scale project (Kadaster International)
- Japanese mapping project (JICA)

Rwanda - Capacity Development in Land Management (2022-2027)

Significant change, results and evidence that we are at least driving in the right direction

- Capacity and Capability development on both technical and organisational matters
- Improved knowledge about land right through awareness campaigns
- Land clinics and boundary correction An established way for the National Land Authority meets community and villagers. The open discussions also leads to boundary corrections when needed.
 - Testimonial from Niyonsenga Jean, a land committee member at Kabaya sector: "The training significantly broadened our understanding of women's land rights, shedding light on the pivotal role of land ownership. It was truly an empowering experience that transformed our perceptions and emphasized the intrinsic value of owning land."

International Training Program

- Sida's International Training Programme (ITP) offers key people from institutions in lowand middle-income countries training in implementing reforms. The objective is a transparent, efficient and democratic state administration under the rule of law.
- To strengthen capacity amongst public institutions, increase trust for public services and secure land rights, in particular for women and vulnerable people
- An ITP connects people, organisations and also countries under one program.
- Lantmäteriet is running two ITPs
 - ITP3.11 Applied Land Governance for East Africa (Rwanda, Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya, Zambia)
 - ITPLZ Applied Land Governance For Liberia and Zimbabwe









International Training Program - Applied Land Governance For Liberia and Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe:

Change project involves creating a market square.

- Finalization of building plans
- Drafting of the lease template
- Awareness and consultations
- Digitizing market layouts into GIS
- Challenge: Fundraising for construction



Liberia:

Change project involves developing process fot approving deeds for Bentol Land.

Close cooperation between governmental organisation, local authorities and citizens.







ITP 311 - Applied Land Governance in East Africa

Testimonial: a single mother from a rural community in Ndake Chiefdom, Zambia gained knowledge and confidence to assert her right to negotiate for a better value of her land when it comes to compensation. With the support of the ITP, she and many others were informed through the community meetings about the importance of having property under customary land valued. The information is not only empowering for Ms. Sakala but also represents the tangible impact of our efforts to ensure equitable land rights for women and marginalized individuals. Jane's story exemplifies how our project has empowered countless others to claim for their rights during displacement.
