- Secretariat established in 2020 to support the network's governance and ensure its sustainability




Training & Education

Capacity development

Short term trainings, curricula development, scholarships

- NELGA partners have so far offered above **51 short term trainings**, providing more than **2470** specialists and managers (34% female) with key qualifications to better perform their functions. Some of the contents have already been processed as digital learning formats and this is to be the standard value
- In 2017, the ALPC guidelines for academic curricula development in the field of land policy were adopted by the AU. Based on these guidelines, 29 curricula have been revised or newly developed at 23 universities through the consultation of African and European academics
- 89 full-time scholarships in cooperation with the DAAD enable students to complete their Master's or doctoral studies. Graduates are enabled to remain connected with NELGA through an alumni network. Additionally, 47 students were granted a scholarship for a course at University of Cape Town.

Research

Research projects, policy-research linkages, advisory missions

- Above **85** regional and/or national demand-driven land research projects were pursued by researchers of NELGA
- With SLGA funding, **NELGA experts** have conducted comprehensive studies commissioned by the World Bank in a number of countries (Ethiopia, Zambia, Tanzania, Uganda etc.) under the Land **Governance Assessment Framework (LGAF)**
- As part of the Comprehensive African Agricultural Development Programme (CAADP), NELGA has conducted studies to support the integration of aspects of land governance within the "New **Agricultural Investment Plans**" at country level
- In 2018, the "African Journal of Land Policy and Geospatial Sciences" (AJLPGS) first continental scientific journal entirely dedicated to the land topic, was established. Issues are being published 2-3 times a year.
- 34 policy dialogues were held at national/regional/AU level and served as a platform to disseminate research results to promote evidence-based decision making
