WOMEN AND LAND CAMPAIGN - NATIONAL





The campaign is now being implemented at the national level by UN-Habitat Lebanon and Tunisia country offices in:

RESEARCH AND DATA COLLECTION

Developed in partnership with the <u>Union of Agricultural</u> <u>Work Committees</u> (UAWC) from Palestine

The study examines the **factors affecting women's land tenure security** in the Arab region (Palestine, Iraq, Tunisia and Kuwait) and their connection to women's **empowerment and socioeconomic development.**

It evidences the reality of **gender- and land-related patterns on the ground and provides actionable recommendations** for decision-makers, stakeholders and activists.

WHY DO WOMEN'S LAND RIGHTS MATTER?



WHY WOMEN'S HLP RIGHTS MATTER

When women have housing, land and property rights...

- ...they are more likely to enjoy a range of interconnected human rights, including adequate housing, protection from forced eviction, adequate standard of living, health, and work.
- ...they are more likely to have the **financial security** they need, the household welfare increases, children have better chances to be educated...
- ...their **autonomy and self-determination** increases, improving their lives and their ability to plan for old-age support.
- ...the **power relations** within the household are rebalanced.
- ... the **agricultural productivity and the overall food production** increases.
- ...their **participation in decision-making**, within their families and communities, and in the overall political debate increases



WHY WOMEN'S HLP RIGHTS MATTER

Further, **in displacement and crises-affected contexts**, when women have housing, land and property rights...

- ...they are better **protected** from violence, extreme weather conditions and other health hazards.
- ...they are better able to **provide for themselves and their dependent** and to cope with the lack of family support.
- ...they are better able to manage the negative economic and social impact of conflict.
- ...their engagement in peace processes and the likelihood of peace agreements to be implemented increase.



WHY WOMEN'S HLP RIGHTS MATTER

The positive impact of protecting women's land rights has been confirmed by a recent study by UN-Habitat, GLTN, UAWC that collected and analysed data in 4 Muslim-majority countries (Tunisia, Palestine, Iraq and Kuwait). The study demonstrates there is a positive correlation between land tenure security and improved living conditions:

Despite the advancement in the last years, regions where most Muslim majority countries are, have the highest gender gap globally, with Yemen, Iraq and Saudi Arabia among the least performant countries



Source: Women, Business and the Law (WBL) database. Note: Figure shows change in the average WBL index score across seven regions between 1970 and 2

The Assets indicator examines gender differences in property and inheritance law

- Difficulty in reforming laws governing property ownership and inheritance.
- Implementation of nondiscriminatory
 legislation is hindered by social norms and women's lack of awareness of their rights.
- Social norms play an important role in influencing whether women can claim their rights to land and property.

THE EVIDENCE: ARAB REGION

Women & men acquire ownership to housing, land & properties through:

- Purchase and inheritance (mostly)
- > Other means: gift, land distribution / allocation, joint ownership through marriage, etc.

MEANS OF LAND ACQUISITION

association

Inheritance is the primary avenue to acquire land for women and men in the Arab region

	67 %	of respondents acquired land through inheritance	71% WOMEN	58% MEN
	27%	of respondents acquired land through purchase	24% WOMEN	35% MEN
	6%	of respondents acquired land through other means lease, grant from the govern- ment, through a Union or	5% WOMEN	7% MEN



Women mostly acquire land ownership through inheritance because:

- Limited formal and paid employment.
- Higher poverty rates.
- Lower access to credit

In Iraq, only 12 per cent of women are part of the labour force compared to 73 per cent of men; In Palestine, 19 per cent of women compared to 71 per cent of men; In Tunisia, 24 per cent of women compared to 70 per cent of men.

EVIDENCE FROM THE ARAB REGION WHY WOMEN ARE RESTRAINED FROM

CLAIMING THEIR RIGHTS?



Women are very often deprived of their (lesser) inheritance rights

EVIDENCE FROM THE ARAB REGION

Women are less likely than men to have a legal document proving ownership rights or to have their names on the land ownership document.



In case of divorce or death of the husband, a woman risks to lose her land and housing, because the couple's property is usually solely registered in the name of the husband, even if the wife has financially contributed to its purchase.

HOW TO INCREASE WOMEN'S ENJOYMENT OF LAND RIGHTS



Legal pluralism in most Muslim majority communities: international law, statutory law, religious law, customary law and informal practices.

Religious law has an important role in regulating inheritance. Muslim women generally are expected to inherit about half of their male counterparts (although there are differences).



INHERITANCE

- Awareness & capacity development: decision makers to understand and enforce inheritance provisions (combating 'renounciation')
- Consider revising statutory law to reduce discriminatory provisions & eliminate illegal gender discriminatory practices;
- Strengthening compensatory mechanisms, such as holistic approach to 'real estate planning' (using wills, gifts, etc.)
- Reform customary and informal practices to reduce discrimination;
- Harmonise legislation and reduce gray areas
- Promote access to justice and disputes' resolution



ADVOCACY AND MARRIAGE

- Advocate and raise awareness
- Protect women's land rights at the time of marriage by:
 - Raising awareness on the role of marriage in defining land and property regimes;
 - Promoting written marital contracts (allowing for different property regimes options);
 - Promoting joint property arrangements for married couples;
 - **Develop the capacities** of all stakeholders to deal with land and marital property issues.

HOW TO INCREASE WOMEN'S ENJOYMENT OF LAND RIGHTS

Strengthen women's rights of use to land and housing

- Strengthen collective and individual rights of use;
- Promote the use of written tenancy and lease agreements;
- Promote the inclusion of women's names in all land tenure documents (individual & joint ownership, lease agreements, occupancy contracts, etc.)





HOW TO INCREASE WOMEN'S ENJOYMENT OF LAND RIGHTS

Provide practical support for women and women groups

(example: establish information and support centres)

Increase women's access to justice & disputeresolution

Improve land administration

Increase women's access to credit and finance

Reform constitution, policies and laws when needed

Are challenges and solutions different than for women in other contexts?

Challenges and solutions are overall similar, with some specificities.
