SUMMARY

The national recovery and resilience plan (Pnrr) is the program with which the government intends to manage the Next generation Eu funds. That is, the economic recovery and relaunch tool introduced by the European Union to remedy the losses caused by the pandemic. Drafted by the then Draghi government and approved by the European Commission in June 2021, the Italian Pnrr has a complex structure. It involves six missions, organized into components, each of which includes a series of measures, which can be regulatory reforms or economic investments. From the ecological transition to the digital one, from healthcare to school, from transport to justice: the subjects on the agenda are diverse and numerous. There are a total of 358 measures and sub-measures, of which 66 reforms. □ For Italy the NGEU represents an unmissable opportunity for development, investments and reforms. The RRF mechanism requires Member States to present a package of investments and reforms: the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR). This Plan, which is divided into six Missions and 16 Components, benefits from the close dialogue that has taken place in recent months with Parliament and the European Commission, on the basis of the RRF Regulation. □ As a case study we bring the town of Montorio al Vomano in the province of Teramo in the Abruzzo region located in central Italy and the town was heavily damaged by the earthquakes of 2009 and 2016 and the center lost many inhabitants due to the unusability of the buildings. In this country the administration has managed to make the most of the PNRR funds by making investments in almost all the missions set by the European government. The municipality carried out interventions on areas that had been abandoned for some time and were suitable for building and instead of making these areas areas of buildings the administration opted to transform these areas into areas of public interest by building pitches, fountains, playgrounds and other things for the community, Furthermore, a bus hub is being built to bring the town back to the centrality it was 40 years ago. The undersigned, as a technician, participated in these most important interventions carried out thanks to the PNRR funds: -- Redevelopment of the Capuchin field
